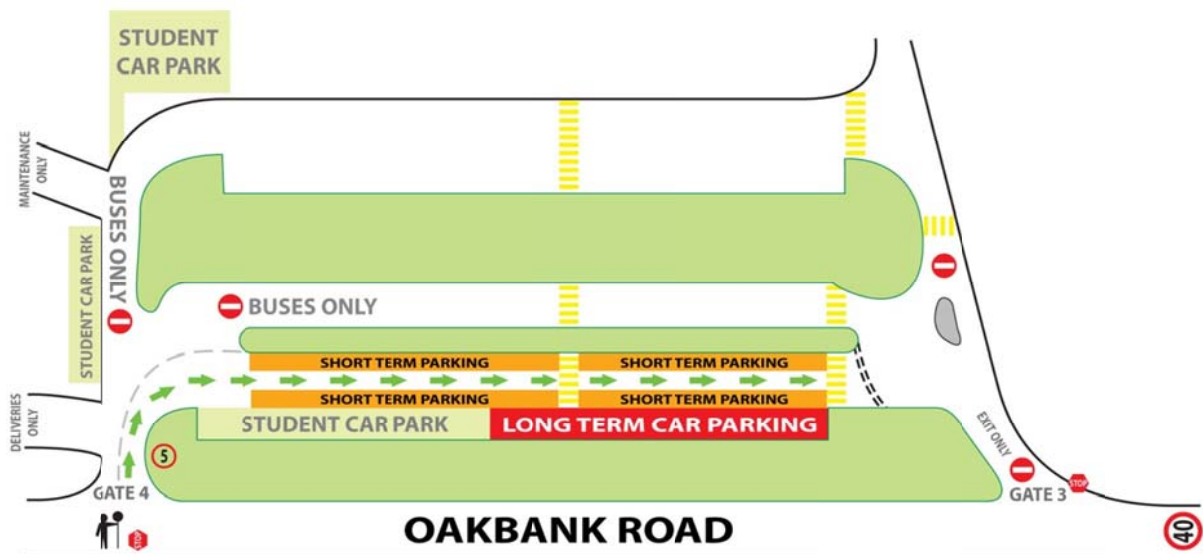


STUDENT PICK UP & DROP OFF



This system has been developed with the safety of our students as of paramount importance and we ask you to follow these guidelines to reduce the risk.

- Speed limit on Oakbank Rd is 40km/h.
- Please do not perform U-Turns on Oakbank Rd for high risk of collision.
- Vehicles must **enter via Gate 4 ONLY**. Vehicles will be asked to wait at the gate if the car park is full.
- Do not use your mobile phones while driving. It sets a bad example for our students.
- Speed limit in school is 5km/hr. **Slow down** please. Speeding through the car park puts people at risk.
- Be mindful of instructions being given by traffic controllers as you enter the college.
- Please use short term parking lanes for quick pick up/drop off only.
- If you need to get out of your car please use long term car parking if it is available.
- The centre lane is intended as a thoroughfare for access to and exit from pick up/drop off points. **NO STOPPING is allowed in the centre lane** for pick up/drop off **AT ANY TIME**. Please travel up the centre lane and pull into an available parking space on either side. Students are to walk to vehicles via the pedestrian crossings.
- Please remind your students to **USE THE PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS AT ALL TIMES**.
- If there is a space in front of you please **move up slowly**.
- All buses depart sharply at 3.25pm. All traffic will be stopped until buses exit. At this time only you may pick up in the centre lane.
- **STOP when exiting Gate 3** and check BOTH ways for oncoming traffic.
- Be patient, slow down, breathe and smile 😊

Students are NOT permitted to exit via Gates 2 and 3 and will be stopped. Student pick up is NOT permitted in front of administration during pick up/drop off times. Students may exit via Gate 1 and walk towards Nepean Highway/Bata for pick up.

Padua Mornington quite efficiently moves up to 1500 students from the school grounds within 15 minutes at the end of each day. Please understand that our designated traffic controllers are often under a lot of pressure at these times and they require your utmost patience and support, as do the other drivers. We thank you for your cooperation.
